Calling All Presenters!

The Florida Alcohol and Drug Abuse Association (FADAA) and the Florida Council for Community Mental Health (FCCMH) are teaming up to present the 2010 annual conference - ***Creating a New Vision: The Path to the Future***. The conference will take place at the Hyatt Regency Grand Cypress Resort in Orlando, August 11 - 13, 2010. We are currently seeking proposals for workshop presentations.

In addition to the high quality training workshops on substance abuse and mental health you have come to expect at the FADAA and the FCCMH annual conferences, this year's conference will emphasize treatment of co-occurring disorders and systems transformation to create a "no wrong door" approach to care in Florida.

We seek workshops from which to build specific tracks in the areas of adults, children/adolescents, clinical/treatment services, evidence-based practices, technology, hot topics, and administration. These tracks will provide a forum for conference participants to assess:

- ❑ system transformation initiatives;
- ❑ model programs and evidence-based practices;
- ❑ recovery and resiliency-based programs;
- ❑ clinical techniques applicable to practices in a variety of therapeutic settings;
- ❑ new research and treatment methods including co-occurring methodologies;
- ❑ issues of interest to clinicians, community-based agencies, consumers and family members; and
- ❑ methods for integrating behavioral and physical health care.

Special consideration will be given to proposals featuring (1) best practices and evidence-based service programs using a "how-to" training approach and (2) administrative and management presentations addressing organizational effectiveness, organizational change and the use of new technologies. Presentations must be designed for an experienced behavioral health care audience with advanced technical skills.

Educational Goals and Objectives

Workshop proposals must have at least three clearly defined learning goals, along with a one-page summary of the presentation. Learning goals should be specific, concise, measurable and realistic for the length of the presentation. Programs must be of sufficient length to present the topic in depth as well as accomplish the stated learning goals. Continuing education speakers must have specialized postgraduate or graduate level training in the subject area; extensive experience, to include not less than two years of education and research in, or practical application of, the subject area; or be a faculty member or former faculty member of a graduate-level, accredited higher learning institute.

Notification and Acceptance

Notification of receipt of a proposal by e-mail or telephone by the conference planning committee will indicate receipt of a complete or an incomplete proposal. Incomplete proposals will not be considered. A representative of the conference planning committee will notify workshop presenters of acceptance by **April 9, 2010**. Additional information or modifications to the proposal may be requested. If accepted, workshop leaders will receive notice with a specific time and date for the workshop and a presenter agreement(s).

Workshop Handouts

We strongly recommend workshop presenters prepare handouts for participants. Materials received at the conference planning office by 5:00 p.m., **July 9, 2010** will be copied by the conference hosts and made available for workshop participants. Materials not received by the deadline become the responsibility of the presenters, who must provide a minimum of 100 copies at their own expense.

Presentation Formats

Lecture:	A single presenter speaking on a single topic, providing a question and answer period at the end.
Panel:	A moderator with two or three presenters offering perspectives on a single issue.
How To:	A presentation format that allows “hands on” participation and interactive discussion by conference participants; often case studies are used as examples.

Workshop Evaluation Criteria

Presentations are sought that feature best practices and evidence-based initiatives with a “how-to” training approach. Presentations should help participants focus on developing leadership, management and clinical skills; positioning their organizations for success; developing new strategies to stay competitive in the market and prepare for future challenges; and introducing innovations and practical solutions in daily operations.

Proposed presentations will be assessed on the extent to which they address service or administrative best practices, promising practices, emerging issues, managed care or system changes that affect the business practices of community-based providers, and offer workshops designed to help providers become more efficient and effective. Presentations will be assessed using the following evaluation criteria:

- ✓ relevance to the conference;
- ✓ address the future of the industry and substance abuse / mental health care;
- ✓ overall importance, quality, innovation, originality, timeliness and content;
- ✓ presenter’s experience and expertise;
- ✓ value or usefulness to the field or profession;
- ✓ practical application of ideas presented;
- ✓ significance of the work; and
- ✓ relevance to several professional licensure categories.

Preferred presentations will be designed for an experienced audience with advanced technical skills equivalent to master’s and doctoral levels. Proposed topics should feature best practice and evidence-based programs, and provide applicable “how-to” information for implementation by workshop participants. We invite submissions on all aspects of mental health and substance abuse related topics. Workshop proposals are due by **April 2, 2010**. Notifications of acceptance will occur by **April 9, 2010**.
